

- I have Plan65. How does Part D affect my coverage?**
 Plan65 is a BCBSOK Medicare supplemental insurance plan for Oklahoma residents who are Medicare beneficiaries (who have Part A and Part B coverage). Plan65 pays many of the deductibles and copayments not covered by the federal Medicare program. If you are a member of Plan65 Plan H, I or J or options 4, 5 or 7, you have a prescription drug benefit in your current policy. Plan65 members with drug coverage will have additional choices to make when Medicare Part D becomes available and will receive a letter from Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Oklahoma in October outlining the complete details. Special seminars will be available to help Plan65 members with these choices.
- If you are a member of a Medicare Advantage Plan (like an HMO or PPO), you may already have a prescription drug benefit from your Medicare Advantage plan that will meet your needs. By joining Medicare Blue Rx, your membership in your Medicare Advantage plan may end. This will affect your doctor and hospital coverage as well as your prescription drug benefits. Read the information that your Medicare Advantage plan sends you and if you have any questions, contact your Medicare Advantage plan.
- If you currently have health coverage from an employer or union, joining Medicare Blue Rx may change how your current coverage works. Read the communications your employer or union sends you. If you have questions, contact your current health benefits administrator or the office that answers questions about your current health coverage.
- Medicare Blue Rx is a Medicare drug plan and is in addition to your current coverage under Medicare; therefore, you will need to keep your Medicare coverage. It is your responsibility to inform Medicare Blue Rx of any prescription drug coverage that you have or may get in the future. You can only be in one Medicare prescription drug plan at a time. Enrollment in this plan is generally for the entire year. You may leave this plan only at certain times of the year, or under certain special circumstances, by sending a request to Medicare Blue Rx or by calling 1-800-Medicare. TYY users should call 1-877-486-2048.

Medicare Blue Rx serves a specific area. If you move out of the area that Medicare Blue Rx serves you need to notify the plan so you can disenroll and find a new plan in your new area. Once you are a member of Medicare Blue Rx, you have the right to appeal plan decisions about payment or services if you disagree. You will read the Evidence of Coverage document from Medicare Blue Rx when you receive it to know which rules you must follow in order to receive coverage with this Medicare drug plan.
