COVID RELIEF FUND

In 2021 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Oklahoma (BCBSOK) provided nearly \$180,000 in grants to nine community-based organizations focused on access to health care, hunger and shelter, including a \$25,000 grant to support for the Muscogee Nation's effort to treat native and non-native Oklahomans with monoclonal antibodies against COVID-19 at the tribe's Council Oak Comprehensive Healthcare in Tulsa.





IMPROVING ACCESS TO CARE

The Caring Van program worked with public health agencies and school districts in Oklahoma City and Tulsa to help students get caught up on childhood immunizations. The vans also helped school districts get older teachers and staff protected against COVID-19 after they became eligible for the vaccines.
